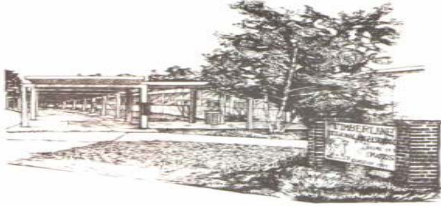

Goodbye





College is in the future, but not yet determined.

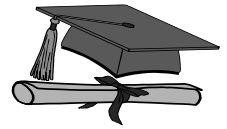
LAUREN CAREY
