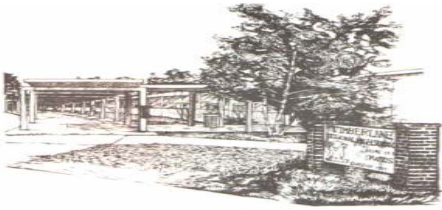

We hope you continue to enjoy the senior bios featured in the newsletter. We're very proud of our seniors and wish them continued success.

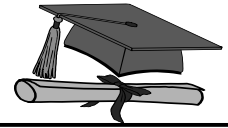

## CHELSEA CASEY

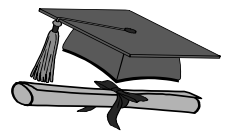
